MARION COMMUNITY UPDATE

AGRICULTURE - ML Ag Ed: The July 2014 meeting of the Ag Ed boosters was held in the Marion Township Building. Marion Local superintendent Mike Pohlman spoke to a sizeable crowd addressing their concerns about the future of the program at Marion Local. Local concerns had been triggered by the departure of FFA coordinator Lucy Bambauer and rumors that the ML board and administration no longer wanted to support the program. Mr. Pohlman did an admirable job addressing these issues assuring the attendees that the board and administration were firmly behind the program and actively seeking a replacement for Ms. Bambauer. Their efforts were rewarded a couple weeks later with the hiring of Kara Uhlenhake who recently graduated from the Ohio State University with a degree in Ag Science. Ms. Uhlenhake is a Coldwater native. The boosters had the pleasure of meeting her at their September meeting and while a bit overwhelmed about the newness of everything she appears to be doing a great job. Turns out no one really had anything to worry about.

AGRICULTURE—ML Ag Ed (cont.): Representatives from Garman/Miller & Associates, Inc attended the September meeting to answer questions about a multi function building for the program. A building planning committee was selected. These individuals will investigate ideas regarding size and features of the building.

AGRICULTURE - Ag Solutions: Laura Johnson a Research Scientist with Heidelberg University addressed the Ag Solutions group on Monday September 8. Heidelberg has 15 flow and nutrient monitoring stations across the state. Local stations are in the Chickasaw, Coldwater and Beaver creeks. Their data reflect that total phosphorous levels flowing into Grand Lake St. Marys from the Chickasaw and Coldwater continue to be high. This is most perplexing since local farmers have taken positive steps to address this issue with cover crops, stream buffers and no manure applications outside of approved dates. Laura noted that it is hard to always draw definitive conclusions from their data because of the many variables they are attempting to measure.

It is most rewarding to see the progress being made on the streets and other infrastructure. Much work remains to be accomplished but we have a great beginning.

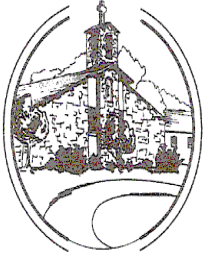

Chickasaw Water: Roberta Acosta with the Rural Community Assistance Partnership (RCAP) continues to meet with Chickasaw's committee. Recent meetings have focused on funding approaches. Local fire department officials are concerned about providing protection to the entire industrial park. The timing of the park project and the water project are out of synch. If the timing were more optimum, water lines and hydrants could be efficiently incorporated with other infrastructure currently being installed. This situation is unfortunate and provides community leaders with some challenges to work through.

NKTelco: NKTelco has been installing fiber optic cable in the Maria Stein area the last few weeks. Their General Manager, Preston Meyer is confident that they will finish all connections into their communications hut on SR 716 by early October. Some additional clean up splicing may be required but he felt that they can start marketing their services in Maria Stein by mid to late October. They will work to extend their services to Chickasaw and Osgood during the winter. Depending on the weather, he foresees that they can begin servicing the villages sometime next summer. Preston advised that they have obtained all required approvals for installation in Chickasaw and Osgood except for some local easements. NKTelco staff will be working with the villages to get the required approvals.

Jim Jordan Visit: US Congressman Jim Jordan addressed a group of about 75 people at the Maria Stein Legion on August 22. Jim represents Ohio's fourth district. He spoke about family, faith and freedom; all topics near and dear to our thriving community. The event was co-sponsored by the MCDO and the Osgood State Bank. MARION LOCAL SCHOOL NEWS

The school year has successfully started and we encourage all parents to check their students' progress through Progressbook, our online grading system. We encourage parents to take this opportunity to sit down with their children and discuss how their classes are progressing. Catching problem areas early is important in building a strong foundation for the rest of the school year. Parent teacher conferences are scheduled for November 11, 13, and 14, but please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher before this time.

This school year we are focusing on preparing our students for the next generation assessments and making sure that we are up-to-date with our computer hardware perspective. We just finished implementing changes from the Race to the Top initiative and we are looking to expand and refine our goals from the past four years. Finally, we are seeing more and more legislation and our goal is to prepare for changes that we will see in accordance to House Bill 487. We also have three goals that remain consistent every year and that is to increase student achievement, be fiscally responsible to our tax payers, and to continue building trust in our community. Recently we received the results from the district report card from the 2013-2014 school year. In regards to student performance we received an "A" rating and had a performance index score of 109.6 which is very good. This rating takes into account how well student achieve on the assessments. It is not just passing the test but also achieving advanced or accelerated. I want to show my appreciation to all Marion Local students, staff, and parents for their hard work.

We recently received a grant from Target that our former art teacher Shannon Painter-Carpenter applied for to purchase pottery wheels. Our Art club will now have the opportunity to expand their skills and have a great new learning experience. This summer we once again challenged our staff to a 200 mile challenge in 90 days. They could accumulate 200 miles through walking, jogging, or biking at a 3:1 mile ratio. I am proud to say that we had 22 accomplish this task and this is important with our overall goal of enhancing our wellness in order to be more effective at work and cut down on healthcare cost. We have welcomed many new staff members into the district this year and they have done a tremendous job.
