**Multi-Use Path**: The Marion Community Greenway Project is making progress towards land acquisition for construction of the multi-use path. Construction is planned for 2021, and bid notification will be made as soon as land acquisition is complete. The committee has requested funding thru the Ohio Capital Budget, which will help offset the remaining funds needed. The timeline for approval of the Ohio Capital Budget is not known at this time. This project would not be possible without the generosity and support of many organizations, businesses and people, all of which help make this community incredible!

The Bike Path Committee would like to thank all of the attendees and participants of the 2020 Party in the Park in September. The Scavenger Hunt style event sent teams off in different directions and had 9 stops with multiple fun activities throughout, including putt-putt golf, hillbilly golf, the wafer challenge, and more. The generosity of the community continues to shine as we get closer to our fundraising goal to make the 2.1 mile multi-use path a reality.

I am most thankful for the opportunity to be with our students and staff each day at school. The senior citizens Christmas luncheon was different this year, but still a success.
