Multi-Use Path: The Marion Community Greenway Project was able to complete a portion of the land acquisition. Construction is planned for 2021, and bid notification will be going out on March 18, 2021. Total cost of the project is estimated at \$1,175,000. The Ohio Public Works Commission' Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program was awarded \$869,500 in grant funds in 2019. The committee had requested funding thru the 2021-2022 Ohio Capital Budget, which was recently approved and the Greenway Project will be awarded \$85,000. After the Ohio Capital Budget award is applied, the remaining balance needed for the project is \$39,886. Spring sports have started and I am hoping more consistent spring weather will follow. Because of inclement weather and exceeding our five calamity days, we conducted our first remote learning day on February 18th. This was a successful educational day thanks to the students and staff working hard on the task at hand. Nothing will ever replace the importance of face to face instruction, but a lot was accomplished on this day and I want to personally thank everyone for their efforts. Many school districts across the state of Ohio and throughout the U.S. are struggling with educating their students and have students who are unaccounted for. I admire the toughness of the Marion Local community and truly believe that rural northwest/west central Ohio is a model to follow on how things should be done. Common sense prevails once again!

The Marion Local school district is seeing a lot of progress academically but also with structural improvements. We are in the final stages of replacing the chillers at the high school building with that project scheduled to end in early April. March 29th is the scheduled date for ground breaking for the four new classroom addition. H.A. Dorsten was selected and approved as the winning bidder for that project. I am excited to begin as our enrollment continues to climb in the lower elementary grades. Finally, we are currently out to bid on renovating our existing allweather track. That project is projected to begin in early June.

We are gearing up for the final nine weeks of the school year. Many great things have taken place and we will finish this year strong. Graduation commencements are set for May 23rd as we prepare to send off the class of 2021.

Mercer County, we are going to continue to transition back to normal operations. As of March 1st, we began offering limited use of our meeting spaces and in-library programming also resumed with restrictions including a limit of 10 patrons in meeting spaces at one time respecting social distancing as well as following all other state mandates. All regular library services (notary, proctoring, etc.) have resumed and are available at the comfort level of each staff. As of March 15th we will also be lifting the time limits on browsing and computer use. Patrons will no longer be limited on the amount of time spent in the library (within reason). There is also no longer a limit to how many patrons can be in the building at one time, again within reason. Hopefully, in the next few weeks and months we will be back to "normal" or as normal as we can get. If you have ANY questions or need clarifications, do not hesitate to contact us.

- Thursday morning story hour is not currently being held, however, beginning in April if the weather is nice we will be having it outside. Please check our Facebook page or contact the library to see if we are having it that day. Hopefully in the near future we can being having it inside as usual.

During the pandemic, library workers continue to exceed their communities' demands and adapt resources and services to meet their users' needs during these challenging times.  - * \$1,500 is the estimated cost per student that is lost due to re-teaching material forgotten over the summer.
 - * 2-3 months of reading & math skills are lost over the summer.
 - * 2-3 hours of reading per week are needed over the summer to prevent learning loss.
 - * 4-6 weeks needed of re-teaching material students have forgotten over the summer.

What can you do to help your child? Sign up for our summer reading program. Your child could win prizes, have fun, and it is a great opportunity for family time. This year's theme is "Tails and Tales" and will begin in late May. More information will be handed out at school or available in our library starting in late May.
