5. AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT: Committee Chairperson – Mark Hardesty

Mark Hardesty provided an update on FFA and Ag Solutions. The St. Henry and Marion Local FFA chapters had a successful fair. Good weather and the movement of the days from the last Thursday to the first Thursday helped increase sales. 30 FFA members will be attending the Farm Science Review Wednesday, September 18th. These students will get to explore the show, career opportunities, and new innovations in agriculture. 10 FFA members competed in the county soils contest last Friday in Fort Recovery. The First FFA meeting was held on September 10th at the Chickasaw Shelterhouse. New members were welcomed, and the first business meeting of the year occurred. The FFA Chapter held a petting zoo at the annual Heritage Days Festival on Sunday, September 15th at The Maria Stein Shrine. On September 28th, Marion Local FFA Members will be at the Celina Farmers Market with a craft making table for kids.

Grand Lake's most recent toxin level was at 14.1 ppb (below WHO-24ppb, above Ohio-8ppb). The lake level is currently 9.5" below normal pool – the lake could really use some rain!

The Lake Erie State of the Science conference was recently held. Based on data from the National Center for Water Quality, it appears that the spring-dissolved phosphorus load has been trending down the last five years, around 32% (plus or minus 12%). However, they are learning that summer loads may have more impact than originally thought. They also spent a lot of time on their current Shallow Run demonstration project, where they hope to get 70+% adoption of no-till, cover crops, and subsurface P placement in that subwatershed and compare that to the neighboring Potato Run subwatershed as the control. The last few years they have been collecting baseline data and now are in process of getting the land enrolled in H2Ohio. This special project will give those landowners involved an additional incentive on top of the H2Ohio incentive rates.
