NEW BUSINESS:

Larry Reichert introduced Kara Uhlenhake as the new Agricultural Education Instructor. She graduated from Ohio State University and was working at Mercer Landmark when she was hired.

Building/Greenhouse Plans with Garmann/Miller:

- If students are present there must be restrooms (both men/women's restrooms), fire alarms, a drinking fountain, and a janitor's sink.
- Sprinklers would be mandatory for any building over 12,000 square foot.
- Probably wouldn't have to have sprinklers for welding/tractor repair
- Building would have to be heated (classroom area only) but not cooled.

- Donated labor: the whole building can be donated labor as long as licensed people are present and helping with the plumbing, electric, etc.
- Would need phone, computer lines, PA system between the two buildings.
- The cost of a building is normally 50% materials/50% labor. A 40' x 80' steel building with concrete floor and heat would cost around \$250,000 (\$80 square foot).
- Garmann/Miller would come up with a layout to present to us.
- They would prepare the plans to get approval from Miami Co.
- If the school is donating at least \$25,000, the plan has to be competively bid.
- Garmann/Miller's fee is \$7%. We would also have to pay for permits, special inspections, etc.
- We would like to get a building completed in two years.

Jim moved to have a building committee. Linda seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mark H., Bart H., Dave O., Larry R., and Shawn T. will be members of this committee. They will meet before the next ag boosters meeting.

KARA UHLENHAKE REPORT:

<u>Garden:</u> There was a lot of produce. She is thinking of using part of the garden for calves/chickens.
