
The school year has successfully started and we encourage all parents to check their students' progress through Progressbook, our online grading system. We encourage parents to take this opportunity to sit down with their children and discuss how their classes are progressing. Catching problem areas early is important in building a strong foundation for the rest of the school year. Parent teacher conferences are scheduled for November 11, 13, and 14, but please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher before this time.

This school year we are focusing on preparing our students for the next generation assessments and making sure that we are up-to-date with our computer hardware perspective. We just finished implementing changes from the Race to the Top initiative and we are looking to expand and refine our goals from the past four years. Finally, we are seeing more and more legislation and our goal is to prepare for changes that we will see in accordance to House Bill 487. We also have three goals that remain consistent every year and that is to increase student achievement, be fiscally responsible to our tax payers, and to continue building trust in our community. Recently we received the results from the district report card from the 2013-2014 school year. In regards to student performance we received an "A" rating and had a performance index score of 109.6 which is very good. This rating takes into account how well student achieve on the assessments. It is not just passing the test but also achieving advanced or accelerated. I want to show my appreciation to all Marion Local students, staff, and parents for their hard work.

We recently received a grant from Target that our former art teacher Shannon Painter-Carpenter applied for to purchase pottery wheels. Our Art club will now have the opportunity to expand their skills and have a great new learning experience. This summer we once again challenged our staff to a 200 mile challenge in 90 days. They could accumulate 200 miles through walking, jogging, or biking at a 3:1 mile ratio. I am proud to say that we had 22 accomplish this task and this is important with our overall goal of enhancing our wellness in order to be more effective at work and cut down on healthcare cost. We have welcomed many new staff members into the district this year and they have done a tremendous job.
