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MARION COMMUNITY UPDATE

AGRICULTURE - ML Ag Ed: Marion Local FFA Advisor, Kara Uhlenhake recently applied for and was awarded an exclusive \$2,500 DuPont Pioneer Grant. Local Pioneer representative, Brent Bergman informed Ms. Uhlenhake concerning the availability of this grant. DuPont Pioneer offered grants to high schools to assist with the implementation of Curriculum for Agricultural Science Education (CASE) in the 2014-2015 school year. CASE empowers teachers for student success by providing inquiry based educational experiences, which enhance the rigor and relevance of agriculture, food, and natural resources subject matter. Concepts are taught using activity, project, and problem based instructional strategies and build skills in the areas of science, mathematics, and English. Additionally, this effort ensures quality teaching by providing extensive professional development for teachers that leads to certification. Applicants needed to include a brief description of the AgriScience program at the school and how this grant will impact AgriScience education, along with a letter of support from the district superintendent. Congratulations Kara on this elite award!

Representatives from the Ag Ed Boosters, Athletic Boosters, and Band Boosters, recently met with the Marion Local Board of Education and Administration to establish a Facilities Committee for Marion Local Schools. These booster groups share concerns with the many facility limitations of our current campus. The mission of each of these groups is being adversely affected. The Facilities Committee will be meeting on a regular basis to determine the most effective approach to infrastructure investment that will enhance the quality education and extracurriculars at Marion Local. Many area schools already have or are planning improved facilities to meet their needs. The Marion Community needs to be become aware of the current limitations as the Facilities Committee plots a course for investing in and enhancing the future of our children.

All are welcome at the monthly Ag Boosters meeting which is held at 8pm on the third Monday of the month in the Marion Local Ag Ed classroom. The next meeting will be held on January 19, 2015.

AGRICULTURE - Ag Solutions: Ag Solutions did not conduct a meeting in December. The next meeting is scheduled for January 5, 2015 and Greenleaf Advisors will be discussing the positive effects of lime/gypsum use. Greenleaf is seeking participants in trials they want to conduct in our watershed. Please strongly consider helping them with their efforts. To that end we would like to get as many practicing farmers to the meeting as possible. Meeting is 8pm, Monday January 5, 2015 at the Marion Township Library, Chickasaw, OH.

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<u>COMMUNITY REPORT – Industrial Park</u>: Site preparation work at the Industrial Park addition is almost finished. Streets are paved, storm and sewer piping laid, and NKTelco has installed fiber optic cabling for internet, phone and TV cable hookups. The site contractor has some top soil that needs to be leveled and the project will be complete – ready for the new owners to start building.

This project, while taking some time, went extremely well. It is a perfect example of what can be accomplished when multiple government and community entities work together for a common purpose. As noted earlier, all the lots have been sold and after all the costs were paid, the MCDO was able to reimburse \$128,103.20 to the County Commissioners to reduce the Tax Increment Financing (TIF) loan. This initial contribution will allow this loan to be paid quicker and cause tax revenue to flow to our school, fire department and other entities sooner.

Thanks to all the good folks who have enough faith in our community to invest serious sums of money and everyone else involved. You all did a great job and it is much appreciated.

<u>Chickasaw Water</u>: Chickasaw continues to seek various funding avenues to pay for their proposed water facility. They are also looking at ideas which would allow them to get village water to the Industrial park addition as soon as possible.

<u>NKTelco</u>: NKTelco held a "Launch Party" at the Marion Township Building on Sunday December 7. Company representatives were very pleased by the turnout. They answered many questions and a number of locals signed up for service.

SHRINE OF THE HOLY RELICS

Above the chapel doors at the Maria Stein Shrine of the Holy Relics a sign reads "Enter devoutly oh Pilgrim". Over the past several months the Shrine has welcomed pilgrims from far and near, some with heavy hearts, seeking the comfort of their faith and others entering with wide eyed wonderment and enthusiasm.

During Advent and Christmas Seasons the Shrine staff welcomed dozens of children for the St. Nicholas program and hundreds of visitors to the 68 crèches from around the world. Each day folks visit bringing family and friends to what has been called "the hidden treasure in their backyard" for prayer and a brief tour. During noon prayer staff and visitors offer prayer intentions called in or sent from around the world through mail or internet. This prayer time begins at 11:45am and lasts about fifteen minutes, all are welcome to join us.

Currently the Heritage Museum on the 2nd floor is undergoing major renovation. This extensive project is possible due to the generosity of a local donor with projected completion date of late June. The new museum will offer six galleries with nearly thirty exhibits focusing on the religious sister's journey and service, as well as local history of the Land of the Cross Tipped Churches.

A new face to the Shrine is that of Diana Russell, who began December 1st in the role of fund development. Diana recently worked at the Cancer Association of Mercer County as organizer of fundraisers and survivor events. She lives in Montezuma with her husband and two children.

Please plan to visit the Shrine this winter, for quiet time in the chapel, for Saturday Mass, a tour, a visit to the Pilgrim Gift Shop or to take in a program. One such program of interest may be the "Armchair Pilgrimage to the Holy Land" with Dr. Anne McGuire who recently returned from a pilgrimage with Archbish-op Dennis Schnurr where she provided the Liturgy and music for the group of eighty pilgrims.
