### **Children's Eve Health**

Everywhere a child's eyes look they're seeing something for the first time. It's up to you to make sure they are seeing everything as clear as possible. When is the first eye exam? The first exam may be scheduled as early as 6 months of age, to ensure that babies' eyes are developing normally and working together. Other exams should occur when the child is 2 to 3 years old, as well as a pre-kindergarten exam and then annually.

What to watch out for:

\*Rubbing of the eyes

\*Frequent headaches

\*Squinting

\*Excessive blinking

\* Holding objects unusually close or far away

\* Eyes that are not aligned or are not working together

Early treatment can stop bigger problems down the road and detect vision issues that could impair evesight for life. Like any trip to the doctor, kids may be scared to see an eye doctor, but many optometrists are skilled at working with children, and can actually make eye exams fun for kids.

# AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT Committee Chairperson – Mark Hardesty

MetaMateria Technologies in Columbus, Ohio and Dr. Larry Brown, OSU Agricultural Professor, are collaboratively working on a trial for phosphorus (P) absorption. MetaMateria has created "PO4 Sponge", a material that captures over 10 times more P than competitive products. The product has significant potential to address the high levels of residual phosphorus that already exists in some of our area fields. Dr. Brown has end of tile structures in various Ohio locations which have traditionally used iron slag to absorb P. Our hope is that replacing the slag with PO4 will dramatically increase the amount of P captured, significantly reducing the amount entering Ohio lakes!

A current frequently discussed Ag topic is that of soil health. Science has proven that some farming approaches deplete soil health. Experts recommend minimum/no till and cover crops. Maintaining growing or even dormant roots in the ground year round has proven to dramatically improve soil health.

The next Ag Solutions meeting will be held at a future date to be announced.

The Ag Ed boosters did not conduct an August meeting. Next meeting will be Monday September 22, 8pm in the ML Ag Ed classroom. All are invited.
