Spring showers bring May flowers. Here are a few gardening tips to help keep you safe and healthy so that you can enjoy the beauty and bounty gardening can bring.

Dress to protect. Gear up to protect yourself from lawn and garden pests, harmful chemicals, sharp or motorized equipment, insects, and harmful rays of too much sun.

- Wear safety goggles and long pants to prevent injury when using power tools and equipment.
- Wear gloves to lower the risk for skin irritations, cuts, and certain contaminants.
- Use insect repellent to protect yourself from diseases caused by mosquitoes and ticks.

Put safety first. Powered and unpowered tools and equipment can cause serious injury. Limit distractions, use chemicals and equipment properly, and be aware of hazards to lower your risk of injury.
