Protein, Weighing the Pros and Cons

There is a lot of publicity these days about protein- diets call for high protein intake, body builders seek protein shakes, and there is even protein ice cream. Protein is a very important component of every cell in the body as it is the building block of bones, muscles, cartilage, skin, and blood. Your body uses protein to build and repair tissues, and to make enzymes, hormones, and other body chemicals.

Since protein is a macronutrient, the body requires a lot of it. But too much of a good thing does exist. By concentrating on protein sources, dieters may be getting too much salt, and not enough calcium, potassium, or other nutrients found in fruits and vegetables.

All diets are a balancing act, but your balance may be different than other individuals. The recommended dietary allowance for protein is 0.8 grams of protein per kilogram of body weight. Meat is a popular source of protein, but there are other alternatives available such as cottage cheese, yogurt, unsalted almonds, chia seeds, beans, quinoa or humus. About ¹/₄ of your plate should come from protein foods.

Consult your medical professional so that your medical history (such as diabetes, anemia, etc.) may be considered.

Details of the party and the fundraising campaign are on the agenda at the next Marion Communities Bike Path meeting, which will be Tuesday, November 28th, 2017 at the Marion Township Building.

The 716 Sidewalk Project has continued to progress. There has been positive feedback from the residents about the approach to self-fund the sidewalks. The MCDO is working to complete a plan and drawing to be approved by ODOT before further development can begin.

Kristen Hemmelgarn from Maria Stein is participating in the Mercer County Leadership in Action program. She has reached out to the MCDO with an offer to assist with any community needs. At the September meeting, the board decided to have Nick Moeller contact her to determine if her offer might fit well with Bike Path Committee efforts. After review of the Bike Path Project, the Mercer County Leadership in Action Committee has chosen a different organization for community assistance.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Industrial Park is continuing construction. MS Welding and Buschur Leasing are in the beginning phases of development. It is exciting to see the progress in the Marion Community!

One of the CD's has reached maturity. The Board discussed the options available on the funds and the decision was made to renew the CD for 24 months at a rate of 1.5%. Nick Moeller moved to approve the CD renewal. Bob Unrast seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.
