Summer Safety

Although summer should be a fun time for outdoor activities and exploration, unfortunately, there is also an increased risk for injury. Summer is often referred to as "trauma season" by health care professionals working in emergency departments. Injuries are the leading cause of death and disability for children and youth. Injury rates are highest during the summer months for children and teenagers because it is the time when they are exposed to more risks.

Safety Tips for Parents and Caregivers

We all want our children to live to their full potential and keep safe and secure. Parents can play a key role in protecting the children they love from injury. Get involved with your child and know where they are going and what they are doing outside. This will allow you to take necessary steps to help protect them.

- Actively supervise your child when engaging in summertime activities, such as swimming and playing on playground equipment or in backyards.
- Use the right safety gear for your child's activities, such as a :
 - *Helmet for bicycle safety- To measure for a bike helmet, wrap a tape measure around the largest portion of the child's head just above the eyebrows and ears and read the measurement in centimeters. Look for a helmet size that matches your measurement.
 - *Life jacket for open water swimming and boating.
- Role model proper safety behavior. Children are more likely to follow safety rules when they see their parents doing so.
- Surround your pool or spa with a four-sided fence to keep children safe. Empty these pools when not in use.
- Keep children away from the grill area while preheating and cooking food.
- Remove potential poisons from your yard, including pesticides and pool chemicals.
- Apply sunscreen rated SPF 15 or higher to child's skin 15 to 30 minutes before going out, and reapply
 according to manufacturer instructions.
- Make sure your child drinks plenty of water while playing outside. Encourage them to rest in the shade or go indoors to avoid over exposure to the heat or sun.
