The screening is open to men ages 55-75 who do not have an established urology provider and who do not have a personal history of prostate cancer. Appointments are required. September is also Suicide Awareness month. Many people have mental health concerns from time to time. But a mental health concern becomes a mental illness when ongoing signs and symptoms cause frequent stress and affect your ability to function. Symptoms of mental illness may include:

*Feeling sad or down

- *Confused thinking or reduced ability to concentrate
- *Excessive fears or worries, or extreme feelings of guilt
- *Withdrawal from friends or activities
- *Changes in eating habits
- *Suicidal thinking

Sometimes symptoms of mental health disorder appear as physical problems, such as stomach pain, back pain, headache, or other unexplained aches and pains.

If you have suicidal thoughts or your loved one has thoughts of harming themselves get help right away:

- Call 911 or your local emergency number.
- Call a suicide hotline number at 1-800-273-8255.
- Reach out to a close family member or friend or spiritual leader.
- Call your mental health specialist. Foundations Behavioral Health Services are located in Celina. Please call 419-584-1825 to make an appointment.

Mental illness is common and can begin at any age, from childhood through later adult years. The effects of mental illness can be temporary or long lasting. However, if you have a mental illness, taking steps to control stress by getting sufficient sleep, eating healthy and getting regular physical activity along with seeing a qualified health professional, you may keep your symptoms under control.
