MARION COMMUNITIES WEBSITE: I'm not sure when the MCDO set up the first Marion Communities website. It was at a time when making updates and modifications were quite challenging. As time progressed, only an individual or two that worked at Marion Local knew how to do it. The website became so outdated that it offered little useful knowledge to anyone who visited it. We contracted with Shelly Bohman at Graphic Communications to set up an up-to-date, fully functioning, easy to use and modify website. This was completed by the end of 2014.

If you've never taken a test drive on https://marioncommunities.com/ please do so. We're proud of the website since it provides the visitor with a great perspective of who and what we are in MCDO land. It even includes a community calendar. Early this year, Shelly updated the website to be "mobile first" which allows device (Cell phones & iPads) users to more easily browse it.

Shelly donated most of her time to accomplish this. She continues to make modifications for a modest maintenance fee. We are very pleased with and appreciative of her outstanding work and dedication to our community.

The MCDO also spent considerable time providing Shelly with the information you see on the site. INDUSTRIAL PARK EXPANSION: Stakeholders from the community and the county continue to meet to discuss plat layouts and schemes to finance the infrastructure required to develop the recently acquired 80 acres into a viable place to locate a business. Infrastructure will be financed through Tax Increment Financing (TIF) and hopefully some grants. A TIF means that all tax revenue from the Park pays for the infrastructure. Taxes normally flowing to the school, township and fire department are redirected until the TIF is paid off.

A recent MCDO conducted survey reflected that 296 full-time people are employed by businesses located in the Industrial Park. Adding in part-time, contractor and off-site brings the total to 528. Remarkable!

MUILTI-USE PATH – Infrastructure chairperson Nick Moeller reports: The Natural Resources Assistance Council (NRAC) District 13, has approved for funding the Marion Township Greenway project with a grant for \$869,500. They also endorsed four other projects in Allen, Logan, Putnam, and Van Wert Counties. The next step is a review for eligibility by the Ohio Public Works Commission who administers the Clean Ohio – Green Space Conservation Program. When granted, the award letters will go out in the next few months. Thanks too to the many organizations, businesses and individuals for the letters of support which were part of the approved grant application.

The Marion Township Greenway project will require local funds of \$305,500. With many generous donations already pledged, local funds committed have reached over \$154,000. This project would not be possible without the generosity and support of many organizations, businesses and people, all which help make this community incredible!

The Marion Community Multi-Use Path committee volunteers are preparing the Marion Township Greenway Founders' Brick Club pledge program. Be part of the foundation of an incredible project for our community with a minimum commitment of \$100 per year for 5 years. We will mail the pledge forms should the approval process go well, and after the award letter is received. Look for it in the mail this spring.

Mark your calendars for two great bike tour events — the first ever Countryfest Bike Tour will be held at the Maria Stein Countryfest on Sunday 6/24/19 at 9 am. The Pac-Man Party in the Park Bike Tour will be held on 9/29/19 at 9 am at the Marion Township Park.

This is great news and kudos to Nick and those who helped with this accomplishment. More info will be forthcoming on this project as it develops.

In regards to the weather, this winter has been interesting. I see brighter days ahead and hope delaying and cancelling school is behind us. We currently have two days to make-up and they include Thursday, April 18th and Monday, April 22nd. I appreciate your understanding and flexibility with the changes to our school calendar.

We recently received funding from the state to put towards safety and security. We decided to use these funds to offset the cost of security cameras at the elementary school. Our elementary building has never had security cameras and it has been on our radar for many years. Thanks to this grant, we decided to take the steps necessary to install this system. It has been a great addition and provides an added level security.

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Marion Local Schools (continued) We also received a large grant from the Bureau of Workers Compensation that can be used for safety and security. We made the decision to upgrade our security cameras at the high school that were installed approx. 12 years ago, and purchase a secured key card entry system at particular outside doors at both the high school and elementary. This work will most likely be done early this summer. We are working hard to provide a safe learning environment for the students in our community. I want to express my appreciation for the state funding we received and the grant from the BWC for allowing us to do this in a costly manner.

The Board of Education and administration are continuing our quest to receive more valuable feedback in regards to the facility and failed levy. The feedback we received has been very good, and we appreciate your honesty and professionalism. We look forward to working with you to determine what our community desires.

What happens when students stop reading over the summer?

- 1,500 dollars is the estimated cost per student that is lost due to re-teaching material forgotten over the summer.
- 2-3 months of reading & math skills are lost over the summer.
- 2-3 hours of reading per week are needed over the summer to prevent learning loss.
- 4-6 weeks needed of re-teaching material students have forgotten over the summer.
