

Village of Chickasaw 2023 Annual Report—Nick Thobe

North Side Infrastructure and Streets

The \$2.1 million infrastructure and street project on the north side of the village was completed in 2023. Cast iron water lines were replaced as well as the 8" main feeder water line going the length of the village from east to west. All streets north of St Rte. 274 were resurfaced with a total rebuild of Wayne Street. Storm drains and lines were upgraded in the Wayne Street area as well. Chickasaw Road/State Street from St. Rte. 274 to the bridge crossing Chickasaw creek was widened and resurfaced to accommodate increased truck traffic. ADA compliant crosswalk ramps were installed along St. Rt. 274. State routes 274 and 716 were resurfaced within the village limits. We also added speed limit radar signs at the entrances to the village on the state highways along with Welcome to Chickasaw village signs at all four entrances. We would like to thank all the residents affected by this project for their patience and cooperation. We hope the project serves you and our village for many years to come.

Village Hall and Offices

An open house was held June 11 at the new village hall and offices. The offices are now at 89 S. Roosevelt St. next to the Fire Station. Renovation of the once stockyard dating back to the late 1800s was paid for with the funds from the sale of the former village hall at 38 Wayne Street. Additionally, the tornado siren was moved to the new location. Much of the labor for the renovation was donated. Thanks to all that helped in this effort. An Eagle project led by Trey Brookhart added a Village sign a flagpole and the 1891 fire bell from the original village hall. Please feel free to stop by to see the new facilities. Village council meetings are the second Wednesday each month.

Grant St.

• The Village dedicated Grant Street, located off South of West Main St by the Ballpark, and added storm line infrastructure to support existing residents and future growth.

Parks

- The park board was very active in 2023 hosting a very successful community picnic June 2,3 & 4. The funds earned at the picnic once again have gone back into park improvements. In addition to the new big toy at the VFW park the park board added a new play area for kids where the volleyball courts were formerly. This area added a fence and should provide young families with a safe and fun area. They also added pickleball courts for those active young adults through seniors. The ball diamond park got a facelift when the aging scotch pines were removed. Thanks to the Park Board and all the volunteers that help make all these things happen.
- The Fire Department once again hosted a successful 5K run on Saturday morning of the picnic. The run brings in a variety of people and provides us a chance to highlight our village as they run through the streets.

Businesses

- The former village hall on 38 W. Wayne Street was purchased by Don Kemper and now the home of Wrenco Trophy and Sportswear. We want to welcome Wrenco and are excited to have them as part of the village. You can find them on Facebook at Wrenco Trophy and Sportswear.
- Chickasaw Machine & Tool has been undergoing a major addition.
- Four Star Veterinary Service has also added office space to its business located on Franklin St.
- Joe and Jean's Town Tavern celebrated 45 years of business.

- Mercer Landmark sold its property at the west end of the village. The parcel on the north side of St Rte. 274 was purchased by Ohio Recycling and the parcel on the south side of St Rte. 274 went to Kevin Homan family farming.
- The Chickasaw Community Mutual Fire Company recently added a new Ladder truck to serve the village and surrounding communities in Marion township. Check them out on Facebook at Chickasaw Volunteer Fire Department.

Things to Look for in 2024

- Electronic payment and email billing will be available.
- More infrastructure activity will be happening. The storm lines along Catholic Street from St Rte. 716 east to Chickasaw creek
 will be replaced and upgraded to a 15" line. The old lines are broken-down in many places and need an update.
- A second water line will be added from Booster Dr. in the Industrial Park to Dead End Rd. on the south side of St Francis subdivision. This will provide a looped water system to the village to optimize flows and quality.
- The final cast iron water lines will be replaced from the corner at Walnut and Maple Streets to the fire hydrant at Center Street by the alley next to Bob Heitbrink's. This activity will also result in storm tile replacement to upgrade broken down tiles.

Eagle Scout Project—Marion Township Greenway

Luke Budde, son of Mike & Shannon Budde, recently received his Eagle Scout certification. Luke is a Senior at Marion Local High School. His project was the construction and installation of two trash receptacles as well as the installation of two benches along the Marion Community Bike Path.
