AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT


Committee Chairperson – Mark Hardesty

Mark Hardesty provided an update on FFA and Ag Solutions. The FFA will continue a busy summer starting with the Officer Retreat, Home & Job Visits, FFA camp, and finishing up at the Mercer County Fair.

Currently the GLSM lake level is around 5.5 inches above normal pool elevation and the most recent toxin data from the City of Celina's intake is included.

Phase 3 wetlands at the Wildlife Area are complete along with the Southwest Greenspace project. Once plants are well-established, Theresa's group will look to add signage and officially open Southwest Greenspace to the public.

The Chickasaw Creek wetland project had about 20 volunteers help plant 3,200 wetland plugs on May 30. We still must complete our tree planting in the fall. This site will also be opened to the public once vegetation is well established and we add some signage.

Marion Local Schools – Marion Local Schools was awarded an \$896,000 grant to bring municipal water from the Chickasaw water tower to Marion Local Schools. The total project cost is approximately \$1.2 million, and the school's portion is approximately \$300,000. The school partnered with Craig Knape from Access Engineering to make this happen for the school!
