



It was an outstanding 2024-2025 school year in which our students achieved at a tremendously high level on their state assessments and provided our community with great entertainment in their extra-curricular activities. Marion Local students are competitors and they work hard to produce both in and out of the classroom. I would like to congratulate all of our students for their successes throughout the year. Congratulations to all of our seventy-two graduates who participated in commencement ceremonies on May 18th. Austin Niekamp was named valedictorian and Ian Rindler was named salutatorian. Of the seventy-two graduates fifteen received Honors Diplomas and twenty-one received the President's Award for Academic Excellence. We are very proud of our graduates and their accomplishments and thank all of the donors that sponsored scholarships to help these individuals further their education.

If you recall, we received a \$896,000 grant from the state to bring municipal water from the Chickasaw water tower to the Marion Local school district. Clock

A clock will be installed in front of the library thanks to the estate of Virgil and Elaine Puthoff. Virgil was a local business owner, long-time village council member, mayor, park board member and president. He along with Don Niekamp were instrumental in founding the Park Board. We are grateful to Virgil and Elaine for their donation to the village. It will serve as a testimonial to Virgil's love for the village and his long-time service.

Main Water line

A 12" main water line was added from Flyer Dr. in the Industrial Park to the Marion Local Schools in Maria Stein. This will provide water to the schools and fire protection to the west end of Maria Stein with fire hydrants located along State Route 716.

Fire Hydrant painting and repair

Fire hydrants in need of painting are being addressed along with any needed repairs and flushing. Fire hydrants are an asset that are now being tracked by the Silversmith data program that was purchased in 2024.

Streets

Center, Mill and Catholic streets are scheduled for paving this summer.

Parks

- The Village applied for and received approximately \$71,000 thru the state capital improvement budget that has been used to install the rubber safety surface at the VFW Park and will also be used to resurface the ball diamond infield. The Park Board match was an additional 20%.
- The park board was very active in 2025 hosting a very successful community picnic May 30, 31 and June 1. The funds earned at the picnic once again have gone back into park improvements. Thanks to the Park Board and all the volunteers that help make all these things happen.
- The Fire Department once again hosted a successful 5K run on Saturday morning of the picnic. The run brings in a variety of people and provides us a chance to highlight our village as they run through the streets.

Businesses

Ohio Recycling has expanded their business and built a new building at the corner of Wayne St and St. Rte. 274. We are proud to have Ohio Recycling as a part of our community.
